## STANDING ORDER REGARDING DOCKETS SET PURSUANT TO TEX.R.CIV.PRO. 165a DISMISSAL DOCKET ("DROP" DOCKET)

No party to any lawsuit has requested this Order. Rather, this Order is a standing Order of the 21<sup>ST</sup> Judicial District, 335<sup>TH</sup> Judicial District, 423<sup>RD</sup> Judicial District Courts, and the County Court at Law of Bastrop County, Texas that applies to causes filed in the Bastrop County District Clerk's Office in Bastrop County, Texas that are pulled and placed on a Dismissal Docket pursuant to Local Rules District Courts 6.19 – 6.22, and Local Rules County Court at Law Rule 8 that are located at:

The  $21^{ST}$  Judicial District,  $335^{TH}$  Judicial District,  $423^{RD}$  Judicial District Courts, and the County Court at Law of Bastrop County, Texas have adopted this Order because of the necessity for clarification of the procedures in implementing Local Rules District Courts 6.19-6.22, and Local Rules County Court at Law Rule 8.

Therefore, it is ORDERED:

A Dismissal Docket will be pulled pursuant to Local Rules District Courts 6.19-6.22 and Local Rules County Court at Law Rule 8, for each Court (the  $21^{ST}$  Judicial District,  $335^{TH}$  Judicial District,  $423^{RD}$  Judicial District Courts, and the County Court at Law of Bastrop County, Texas) and each Judge will handle their own docket.

A Motion to Retain filed by a party does NOT automatically remove the cause from the Dismissal Docket.

A Motion to Retain MUST specifically allege good cause as to why the cause should not be dismissed for want of prosecution.

All parties and their attorneys MUST appear at the scheduled Dismissal Docket date unless they are otherwise released from appearing by the Court. The Dismissal Docket date will also be used as a Status Hearing date to provide trial dates for the causes that are retained.

The Bastrop County District Clerk's Office will maintain a Master List of cases that are originally placed on the Dismissal Docket for a scheduled date.

If any part of this Order is different from any part of a previous Order that has already been entered regarding a specific cause, the previous Order's provisions prevail. This Order remains in full force and effect until a different Order is signed by a Court.
