- 3. A copy of the court order that suspended your license, unless you checked the last box on Section 2.
- 4. Letter from your employer or immediate supervisor on your employer's letterhead (or an affidavit) that verifies your work schedule, if you have asked the court to let you drive to work.
- 5. A money order or cashier's check for \$54.00 (fee change effective 01/01/2022) made payable to Bastrop County JP#1.

NOTE: if an occupational License is granted by the court, a certified copy of the petition and Order must be on your possession the entire period that your regular license is suspended.

You will need to send a copy to DPS, along with a copy of the SR-22 and a money order for \$10.00 payable to DPS for your occupational License. (Reinstatement Fees may also apply; contact DPS regarding these and other requirements).
