On May 10, 2019, Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC (“Oncor”) and LCRA Transmission Services Corporation (“LCRA TSC”) filed a joint application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (“Commission” or “PUC”) seeking approval for the exchange of certain certificated transmission lines and substation facilities between Oncor and LCRA TSC (“Joint Application”). The docket number and style of this Joint Application are Docket No. 49536, *Joint Application of Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC and LCRA Transmission Services Corporation to Transfer Certificate of Convenience and Necessity Rights*. Both Oncor and LCRA TSC are engaged in the transmission of electricity under certificates of convenience and necessity (“CCNs”) on file with the Commission. In their Joint Application, Oncor and LCRA TSC request that the Commission approve the transfer of a total of approximately 19 miles of transmission lines located in Bastrop, Coryell, Eastland, Lampasas, Nolan, Travis, and Williamson Counties from Oncor to LCRA TSC and five substations located in Brown, McCulloch, Menard, and San Saba Counties from LCRA TSC to Oncor. The transmission facilities subject to this Joint Application are as follows: approximately 5.7 mile, 138 kV transmission line from Oncor’s Eskota Switching Station to the existing Eskota – McElmurray Point of Interconnection, located in northeast Nolan County, east of the City of Sweetwater and south of, and generally parallel to, Interstate Highway 20; an approximately 8.9 mile, 138 kV transmission line from Leon Switching Station to the existing Leon Switching Station – Putnam Switching Station Point of Interconnection, located in northwest Eastland County, south of the City of Eastland in the vicinity of Lake Olden; an approximately 0.9 mile, 138 kV transmission line from Oncor’s Round Rock South Substation to the existing Round Rock South – Wells Branch Point of Interconnection, located in Travis and Williamson Counties, north of the City of Wells Branch, and on the west side of, and generally parallel to, Interstate Highway 35; an approximately 2.2 mile, 138 kV transmission line from Oncor’s Elgin Substation to the existing Elgin Tap Point of Interconnection, located in north Bastrop County, southeast of the City of Elgin, generally parallel to Highway 95 South; and an approximately 1.3 mile, 138 kV transmission line from the existing Lampasas – Temple Point of Interconnection to a new Lampasas – Temple Point of Interconnection, located in Coryell and Lampasas Counties, south of the City of Copperas Cove and generally perpendicular to Highway 190. The proposed transmission line transfers listed above include all associated series path elements in the sections being transferred.

The substations subject to this Joint Application include the following 69-12.5 kV substations: Terry, located at 1710 County Road 122, Richland Springs, San Saba County, Texas 76871, Dutton, located at 362 East US Highway 190, Brady, McCulloch County, Texas 76825, and Hext, located at 250 Pope Lane, Hext, Menard County, Texas 76848; the following 69-24.9 kV substation: Camp San Saba, located on 137 County Road 206, McCulloch County, Texas 76825;

and the following 138-24.9 kV substation: Camp Bowie, located at 7400 South Farm to Market Road 45, Brownwood, Brown County, Texas 76801. The substations listed above include all power transformers, 138kV, 69kV, 24.9kV, and 12.5kV protective devices, electrical equipment, control houses, structures, foundations, buswork, conductors, fencing, real estate, and all appurtenances owned by LCRA TSC at each substation site.

No new facilities are being sought in this filing, nor are any service area boundaries to be affected by this Joint Application.


