So, what is CERT?



- CERT is an acronym for Community Emergency Response Team
- CERT is a nationally recognized program under the FEMA umbrella
- CERT is **comprised of community volunteers** who have an interest in disaster response and who are willing to invest time in formal training and in responding when needed
- CERT provides for community self-sufficiency through the development of multifunction response teams who act as adjunct to the county's emergency services during major disasters
- CERT members can also assist with non-emergency projects that help improve the safety of their community



What's the history of CERT in Bastrop County?

- CERT was organized in Bastrop County in 2006, sponsored by Bastrop County Office of Emergency Management
- 2006 bylaws reflected Michael C. Fisher as Chairman of the Board, Richard G. Jones, president; and Fay H. Jones, secretary
- The BCCERT Mission Statement: "Bastrop County CERT is a charitable organization whose mission is to provide support to emergency response and emergency preparedness organizations in Bastrop County; train and organize volunteers to provide support; and otherwise assist to improve safety and emergency preparedness in Bastrop County."
- Bastrop County CERT program dissolved in 2014
- Bastrop County CERT program reinstated in 2021 with Preston McGrew, deputy director; Teri Dusold, asst. deputy director; Phil Dusold logistics; Matthew West, training





What Can CERT do?



- Provide Support to First Responders on scene during or after an emergency/disaster including:
 - Fires
 - Floods
 - Man-made disasters
 - Search Operations
- Educate their communities on the importance of emergency preparedness



What Can CERT do?

Respond after a disaster:

- Locate & turn off utilities, if safe
- Extinguish small fires
- Treat injuries
- Conduct light search & rescue
- Help relieve survivor stress

Community Services

- Traffic control
- Distributing smoke alarms
- Promote community awareness of potential hazards & preparedness measures
- Supplement staffing at special events, such as community festivals





Is There Training for CERT Members?

"CERT training covers basic skills that are important to know in a disaster when emergency services are compromised. With training an practice, and working as a team, members will be able to protect themselves and maximize their capabilities to help for the greatest number of people after a disaster." --CERT Basic Trainings / Ready.gov

What CERT Cannot do?

- CERTs Do Not:
- Suppress large fires
- Enter heavily damaged and dangerous structures
- Perform hazardous materials cleanup
- Conduct medical, fire, or search and rescue operations beyond their training
- Activate or deploy unless called for in their procedures
